MASSIMO MERCELLI



Massimo Mercelli is the flautist in the world with the most important dedications; star composers as Penderecki, Gubaidulina, Glass, Nyman, Bacalov, Morricone, Galliano, Sollima wrote and/or performed with him. Massimo studied flute with the famous flautists André Jaunet and Maxence Larrieu. At just nineteen years of age, he became the principal flute at Teatro La Fenice in Venice, won the Prize Francesco Cilea, the Concorso Internazionale Giornate Musicali and the Concorso Internazionale di Stresa.

He has performed as a soloist in some of the world most prestigious concert halls, like Carnegie Hall, New York, Herculessaal, Gasteig, Munchen, Philarmonie, Berlin, NCPA, Beijing, Teatro Colon, Buenos Aires, Concertgebouw, Amsterdam, Auditorium RAI, Turin, Auditorio Nacional de Madrid, Puccini Festival, Victoria Hall, Geneve, San Martin in the Fields and Wigmore Hall, London, Parco della Musica, Rome, Philarmonic hall, Saint Peterburg, Philarmonic hall Warsaw, Čajkovskij Hall in Moscow, and in Festival as Ljubljana, Berlino, Santander, Vilnius, San Pietroburgo, Bonn, Festival Cervantino, Rheingau, Jerusalem, Warsaw, esibendosi con colleghi quali Yuri Bashmet, Valery Gergiev, Krzysztof Penderecki, Philip Glass, Michael Nyman, Massimo Quarta, Ennio Morricone, Luis Bacalov, Peter-Lukas Graf, Maxence Larrieu, Aurèle Nicolet, Anna Caterina Antonacci, Ramin Bahrami, Albrecht Mayer, Gabor Boldowsky, Jiri Belolhavec, Federico Mondelci, Jan Latham-Koenig, Catherine Spaak, John Malkovich, Susanna Mildonian, with orchestras as Berliner Philarmoniker, Sinfonia Varsovia, the Filarmonica del Teatro Regio di Torino, Moscow Soloists, Filarmonica Toscanini, Opera di Roma, Wiener Symphoniker, Cameristi del Teatro alla Scala, Prague Philarmonia, Filarmonica di San Pietroburgo, i Virtuosi Italiani, Salzburg Soloists, la Moscow Chamber Orchestra, i Solisti Aquilani, Franz Liszt Chamber Orchestra, I Musici, i Solisti Veneti.

Massimo Mercelli is artistic director and founder of Emilia Romagna Festival. Since 2001 he has been a member of the board of counselling of the European Festivals Association (EFA) and on April 2011 he was elected vice president until May 2017. On 11 September 2006 he performed at the Dag Hammarskjold Library Auditorium of the United Nations. He performed in the Berliner Philharmonie with Berliner Philarmoniker and in the Big Hall of Moscow Conservatory, in a Gala Concert with Yuri Bashmet and Gidon Kremer. Massimo Mercelli has made two tournée with "I Virtuosi Italiani", conducted by Krzsystof Penderecki, playing his Sinfonietta for flute and strings.

Recently he performed at London's Wigmore Hall and Salzburg's Mozarteum, held a Master Class at the Rostropovich Foundation and played the first performance of Philip Glass's composition "Façades" for flute and piano, with the composer at the piano. He performed the World Premiere of the new Cantata "Vuoto d'Anima Piena" by Ennio Morricone, under the baton of the composer and he has taken part in the Festival at Warsaw Philharmonic for the 75 years of Maestro Penderecki. In the 2009-10 season he played in Milan at MiTo Festival, at Prague's National Theatre with Denyce Graves, in China with Luis Bacalov at Shangahi EXPO, and he performed the World Première of the concert

for flute and orchestra by Michael Nyman dedicated to him. In January 2011 he played at Čajkovskij Hall in Moscow under the baton of Yuri Bashmet and in November he played at MusikVerein in Wien.

In 2012 the Orange Mountain Record has released "Massimo Mercelli performed Philip Glass" CD with Philip Glass's chamber music for flute. Mercelli has been a jury member of the following international competitions: International Competition of Geneva; Concours de Flute Jean-Pierre Rampal - Concours Internationaux de la Ville de Paris, Concert Artist Guild of New York (USA), Fischoff Chamber Music Competition of South Bend (USA) Beijing Flute competition (China).

AS a pedagogue he gave Masterclasses in Oslo Norges Musikkhogskole (Norway);Sibelius Academy in Helsinki (Finland); Cleveland Institute of Music (USA); Akron University (USA); Trinity college of music (UK); Mannes School of New York (USA); Singapore Conservatory (Singapore) Oberlin Conservatory (USA); Bankok University (Thailand); North Carolina University (USA); Universitad of Santiago(Chile); Taiwan University (Taiwan); Matan Project –Tel Aviv (Israel); Rostropovich Foundation (Vilnius, Lithuania).

Recent engagements include the recording of Bach's sonatas for Decca with Ramin Bahrami, the world première of the new concerto dedicated to him by Sofia Gubaidulina and
